NOT INCLUDED IN PRICE:

Passports, visas, vaccinations (if required), laundry, lunches not on the tour menu (food outside the contracted menu will be billed prior to leaving the hotel or restaurant), excursions not listed, telephone/international data, mini-bar, alcohol, other beverages, airport transfers on non-qualifying flights, portage at airports, excess baggage fees, additional airline fees after registration, travel insurance, and all other items not explicitly mentioned.

PAYMENTS & FEES:

A non-refundable deposit of **\$500** per person is due upon registration, with a second deposit of **\$1,000** per person required within 21 days thereafter. Credit cards are only accepted for the initial **\$500** deposit; subsequent payments must be in check, ACH transfer, bill payment, or wire transfer; all payments are required in US Funds.

Final payment is due no later than 150 days prior to departure.

Registrations after 150 days require full payment and may incur a \$300 late fee if received 149-120 days before departure. **Failure to make final payment by 120 days prior to departure results in automatic cancellation, forfeiture of the \$1,500 deposit, and potential additional fees.**

imagine Tours and Travel, LLC (hereafter referred to as *imagine*) reserves the right to impose a surcharge if the dollar declines by more than 2% against the destination currency based on booking date (04/23/25).

GROUP SIZE & SUPPLEMENTS:

Tour pricing assumes a minimum group size of 20 passengers.

Smaller groups may incur supplements:

- \$150 per person (19-16 travelers)
- \$195 per person (15-12 travelers)
- Tours with fewer than 12 travelers may be canceled due to insufficient participation.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Price is based on double occupancy (two people sharing a room).

Single rooms may be smaller than double rooms and, when available, incur an additional supplemental charge of **\$1,797 for the basic itinerary**. Roommates are assigned if available; otherwise, single-room occupancy may apply. Roommates may be assigned as late as 120 days prior to departure when applicable.

ITINERARY & CHANGES:

imagine reserves the right to adjust itineraries due to airline schedule changes. Changes requiring extra nights incur \$195 per person per night (\$295 for single rooms). You will be notified in writing of said changes when possible. Meals for additional overnights are not included. Changes and/or deviations from the program and/or departure city listed by the passenger must be provided in writing no later than 120 days prior to departure.

All deviations are subject to a **\$250 administrative fee** plus applicable airline fees. **All tours are made final at 120 days prior to departure.**

No changes (including additions) may be made after this time.

LAND ONLY:

Land Only price is **\$4,497** per person, excluding international flights.

Land Only passengers may be responsible for transfers and/or additional overnights incurred by booking their own flights. Passengers changing from the regular tour (with group airfare) to Land Only after 120 days prior to departure will be charged a fee of \$195 per person.

AIRLINE TICKETS & SEATING:

The ITINERARY

Day 1 – Monday, May 11: Depart USA for Amsterdam, Netherlands

We meet at the airport to begin our journey through the heart of Europe's rich Christian heritage. As we take off toward Amsterdam, we settle in for rest and reflection—knowing that over the coming days, we'll explore the historic path of the church, from early expressions of faith to the pivotal voices that shaped its future.

Day 2 – Tuesday, May 12: Arrive in Amsterdam, Netherlands – Embarkation

Upon arrival in Amsterdam, we meet our guide and board our beautiful river cruise ship—our floating hotel for the next seven nights. This evening, we gather for a welcome toast with our captain and crew, launching our journey through centuries of faith, conviction, and renewal.

Day 3 – Wednesday, May 13: Nijmegen, Netherlands – A City of History and Beauty

We dock in Nijmegen, the oldest city in the Netherlands with roots stretching back more than 2,000 years. As we explore Roman ruins, medieval churches, and cobbled streets, we're reminded of the cultural and religious foundations that preceded the Reformation. Highlights include St. Stevenskerk, the city's towering 13th-century church—a symbol of enduring faith through turbulent centuries. We return to our ship for dinner & overnight.

Day 4 – Thursday, May 14: Cologne, Germany

Cologne rises along the Rhine with a skyline crowned by the majestic Kölner Dom, one of the most iconic cathedrals in Europe. As we walk through this vibrant city, we see how early Christianity spread through Roman influence and later endured through wars, plagues, and reform. The Gothic grandeur of the cathedral, which houses relics of the Three Magi, reminds us of a time when the church shaped the very structure of city life. We return to our ship for dinner & overnight.

Day 5 – Friday, May 15: Rüdesheim, Germany

Today we visit Rüdesheim, a charming riverside town that reflects the everyday rhythm of Christian life in medieval Germany. We enjoy a musical stop at Siegfried's Mechanical Music Cabinet Museum and take the cable car to the Niederwald Monument, which overlooks the Rhine and the surrounding vineyards. We reflect on the role of the faithful remnant throughout church history—those who lived quietly yet faithfully, preserving the gospel from generation to generation. We return to our ship for dinner & overnight.

Day 6 – Saturday, May 16: Heidelberg & Worms, Germany

We begin the day in Heidelberg, home to Germany's oldest university and a city steeped in theological tradition. We'll visit the iconic castle, taste local wine, and see the world's largest barrel. We will wander through cobblestone streets, visit the Marktplatz, and admire the beautiful architecture, including the Old Bridge (Alte Brücke). Here we'll also visit the Church of the Holy Spirit, which housed both Catholic and Protestant worshippers—a symbol of the tension and transformation of the church during the Reformation. Later, we travel to Worms, where Martin Luther stood before the emperor at the Diet of Worms (1521) and boldly proclaimed his conscience was captive to the Word of God. While Luther's stand was crucial, it also reminds us of a broader stream of believers throughout church history—including Anabaptists and Baptists—who risked their lives to uphold biblical authority and believer's baptism. We return to our ship for dinner & overnight.

Day 7 – Sunday, May 17: Strasbourg, France

Strasbourg offers us a glimpse of the church's layered history—from Roman roots to Reformation revival. We tour the picturesque Petite France quarter, visit Gutenberg Square (named for the man whose printing press helped circulate Scripture), and behold Strasbourg Cathedral—once the tallest structure in Christendom. We consider how the accessibility of the Bible helped ignite change across Europe and reflect on the early gatherings of believers committed to Scripture, regeneration, and local church life. We return to our ship for dinner & overnight.

Day 8 – Monday, May 18: Breisach, Germany & Colmar, France

In Breisach, perched above the Rhine, we visit the striking St. Stephen's Cathedral before traveling to nearby Colmar—an enchanting town of half-timbered homes and canal-lined streets. As we stroll its old town, we encounter stories of perseverance and artistry, including the birthplace of Auguste Bartholdi, sculptor of the Statue of Liberty. While not tied to a specific denominational movement, towns like Colmar shaped Christian Europe's imagination, aesthetics, and culture. We return to our ship for dinner & overnight.

Day 9 – Tuesday, May 19: Basel, Switzerland – Disembarkation – Zurich

We disembark this morning in Basel, a city of cultural crossroads where three nations meet. As time allows, we'll explore the red Town Hall and view the medieval cathedral before transferring to Zurich for our return flight. Along the way, we reflect on the journey we've walked—one that spans cathedrals and cobblestones, bold reformers and faithful witnesses, all pointing to the unshakable foundation of Christ and His Church.



Day 9 – Tuesday, May 19: Base – Zurich

After disembarking in Basel, we begin our journey in this vibrant crossroads of Switzerland, France, and Germany. In the heart of Old Town, we take in the Basel Minster, a beautiful Romanesque-Gothic cathedral that once echoed with medieval worship—and later stood as a silent witness to the growing call for biblical reform. From here, we travel to Zurich, where we'll walk through the historic Altstadt (Old Town). Along the way, we visit the Wasserkirche—once a Catholic chapel, later transformed into a center for the study of Scripture—and the Fraumünster, featuring its stunning stained-glass windows. Our final stop is the Grossmünster, where Huldrych Zwingli boldly preached verse-by-verse through the Bible, sparking a movement focused on biblical authority, not religious tradition. We check into our hotel, enjoy dinner, and prepare for another day of discovery.

Day 10 – Wednesday, May 20: Zurich – Bern

We begin with a panoramic view from Uetliberg Mountain, offering a breathtaking look at Zurich's landscape. Back in the city, we visit Lindenhof Hill, where stories of civic freedom, early believers, and gospel convictions intersect. Then we depart for Bern, Switzerland's capital city and one of the best-preserved medieval centers in Europe. As we walk through its cobblestone streets, we reflect on how believers throughout history sought to remain faithful in both public and personal witness. We visit Bern Cathedral—the tallest church building in the country—and the Nydegg Church, which played a role in the local movement to return to the authority of Scripture. With time to explore the arcades and enjoy the beauty of Bern, we finish the day with dinner and overnight.

Day 11 – Thursday, May 21: Bern – Geneva

Today, we drive to Geneva, a city rich in church heritage and missionary legacy. We begin at the International Museum of the Reformation, exploring how Scripture-centered teaching began to reshape not only theology, but education, missions, and the way believers lived out their faith. At St. Peter's Cathedral, we step into the very pulpit where John Calvin preached with deep conviction and reverence for God's Word. Nearby, we visit the Reformation Wall, featuring the likenesses of Calvin, Farel, Beza, and Knox—men who stood firm for the gospel and helped lay foundations many churches still build upon today. After lunch (not included) at a lively local market, we enjoy a stop at the Patek Philippe Museum and take time to reflect along Lake Geneva's shores, pausing by the Flower Clock and the iconic Jet d'Eau fountain. We close the evening with dinner and overnight in this remarkable city.

Day 12 – Friday, May 22: Departure from Geneva

After breakfast, we transfer to the Geneva Airport for our return flight, closing out a journey filled with spiritual insight, cultural beauty, and a deeper appreciation for the enduring call to remain faithful to the gospel of Christ.

While we do our best to ensure that all items listed in your itinerary are included, there are times when conditions beyond our control may affect your program or itinerary, including but not limited to air carrier changes, delays, weather, political climate, time constraints, or changes made by your tour leader and tour guide.
